Recycle Your Pesticide Containers!

For 26 years the Nebraska Extension Pesticide Safety Education Program has been coordinating a statewide pesticide container recycling program. The recycling program helps promote a healthy and sustainable lifestyle for agriculture producers who want to leave a positive impact on the environment.

All you have to do is clean and dry your intact pesticide container by pressure or triple rinsing it out, remove any caps, labels, booklets, and slipcover plastics. Then drop off



your containers to the various year-round or seasonal collection sites!
